

The App Store Accountability Act

THE PROBLEM

Parents are excluded from the most critical online safety decision: whether an app reaches their child's device. App stores fail to warn families about sextortion, drug access, predatory grooming, and data exploitation. Children routinely sign complex digital contracts they cannot understand, waiving rights and allowing immediate collection of personal data.

THE SOLUTION

The App Store Accountability Act (ASAA) is a practical, parent-led consumer protection law that puts families—not Big Tech—in charge. It creates a single, durable safeguard at the centralized app-store level instead of trying to regulate thousands of individual apps.

HOW IT WORKS

- 1 Child attempts to download an app.
- 2 App store recognizes the child's age status.
- 3 Parent receives clear, meaningful risk information.
- 4 Parent approves or denies the download.

KEY BENEFITS

- Standardized protection at the gate, not hidden settings in every app.
- Enforceable and scalable against overseas developers and fast-moving AI companies.
- Empowers parents with the final say before data is collected.
- Already passed in 4 states by ordinary parents.

WHAT THIS BILL ISN'T

- It does not ban apps or censor lawful content.
- It does not tell parents how to raise their children.
- It does not require government-issued ID verification.
